

2012 Legislative Agriculture Chairs Summit

Resolution on Country of Origin Labeling

Whereas, the State Ag and Rural Leaders, (SARL) is comprised of agriculture and

rural leaders of state and provincial legislative bodies from the US and

Canada; and

Whereas, the U.S. Country of Origin Labeling (COOL) legislation has been a

source of trade dispute between the U.S. and Canada; and

Whereas, the World Trade Organization (WTO) has ruled that the means by

which COOL was implemented is not consistent with U.S. trade

obligations; and

Whereas, the strength of the U.S.-Canadian trade relationship has created jobs

and financial growth in both countries; and now therefore be it

Resolved, that SARL encourages the U.S. to waive an appeal of the WTO Dispute

Panel's ruling on COOL and further encourages the United States Congress to make a legislative amendment that would bring COOL into conformity with the U.S. WTO obligations without hindering the ability of

the United States to continue to implement COOL for informed

consumer decisions.
