

State Agriculture and Rural Leaders

2013-1 Resolution on the Veterinary Medicine Mobility Act of 2013 Passed June 9, 2013

Whereas, the State Ag and Rural Leaders, (SARL) is comprised of agriculture and rural leaders of state and provincial legislative bodies from the US and

Canada; and

Whereas, the practice of veterinary medicine is unique in that veterinarians treat

multiple species of animals in different practice settings and veterinarians' ability to practice medicine often requires that they be able to provide

mobile or ambulatory services; and

Whereas, the provision of mobile or ambulatory services is particularly important in

rural areas and for the care of large animals because it is often not feasible, practical or possible for owners to bring livestock to a bricks-and-

mortar clinic or hospital; and

Whereas, controlled substances are used by veterinarians in treatment, research

and disease control activities that may be conducted away from their

registered principal places of business; and

Whereas, the Drug Enforcement Administration has interpreted the federal

Controlled Substances Act to make it illegal for veterinarians to transport

controlled substances for use outside of a registered location; and

Whereas, the Drug Enforcement Administration has informed organized veterinary

medicine that transporting controlled substances by veterinarians legally

will require a statutory change; and

Whereas, it is imperative that veterinarians be able to legally transport controlled

substances to the location of the animal patient in the interest of animal

health, welfare, and public safety; and

Whereas, H.R. 1528, the Veterinary Medicine Mobility Act, was introduced in the

House of Representatives and similar language is included in S 954, the

Senate's Agriculture Reform, Food, and Jobs Act of 2013 to allow

veterinarians to transport controlled substances for treatment of animals;

now therefore be it

Resolved, that SARL supports the passage of H.R. 1528 or inclusion of similar

language in the final farm bill of 2013; and be it further

Resolved, that this resolution be submitted to members of the United States

Congress.
